COMMUNITY COMING TOGETHER FOR MEMPHIS



"He's like a brother to me," Barlow said about the child's father. "He has done a lot for the community without expecting anything in return." Barlow, who has been providing meals for those on the frontline of the current pandemic, opened up his restaurant in Barnegat on Saturday, May 2nd, for the one day only to sell his famous Brisket, Pulled Pork, Smoked Wings and Ribs where 20% of his sales would be put into

a trust fund for the Rank family. Of course, this was all done by ordering for curbside pickup. He also held an auction through his facebook page, which unfortunately will be over by the time you read this.

However, other businesses jumped on the bandwagon to contribute to the trust fund, which was also set up by Barlow. Advanced Furnace & Air Duct Cleaning, located at 1039 Atlantic City Blvd. in Bayville, is donating \$25 of each job that is booked from now until Saturday, May 9th, at 5pm.
