## DRAMA CLUB ACCEPTING ADULTS

As was stated in Revelations #57, I was challenged by Rosalie Mulvaney to open the Drama Club up to adults, as well as youth. The Drama Club meets on Wednesdays from 5:00pm until 6:30pm in Fellowship Hall. After speaking with the youth involved, the Drama Club is now officially open to adults. The youth that are officially enrolled in the club include Bella LaMorte, Isabelle Van Arsdale, Gia Van Arsdale, Naomi Keith, Carly Carpini and Abby Michalkowski. The lone adult is Nicoletta Keith. For the purpose of Safe Sanctuary, my primary assistant has been Sally Potter, with Maddie Stapleton and Gina LaMorte as alternate assistants. There will be a Safe Sanctuary session held soon by Pastor Jonathan and myself for those interested in helping out with the Drama Club or any of our other missions within the church. In addition, I am hoping that we can eventually get the Youth Group up and running again.

I would like to start looking at Easter plays for the troupe to perform when the season approaches.

Drama sessions cover Warm-Up Exercises, Improv, Monologues and Scene Study. The techniques learned throughout these sessions are not just tools that can be used in theater, but in everyday life as well. Deep Breathing Exercises, as well as the 555 Breathing Technique, are utilized to help with bodily posture and mental focus. As they master this, we move into the Alexander Technique.

Another focus in the class is Enunciation. Combining the ability to speak clearly with a certain volume to their voice is a must practice. Everybody must reach that ability at their own pace. One of the first things they learn is Stage Direction. This encompasses knowing the difference between House Right and Stage Right, as well as Upstage and Downstage.

Teamwork is an important part of the process. It is not just about the performer looking good but helping your scene partner look good. The Four Levels of Analyzing a Character take the students through the Physical, Psychological, Social and Moral aspects of a performance.

When it comes to Improv, many techniques are discussed including the Viola Spolin Method, which was used at Second City in Chicago. The techniques of acting that are discussed and practiced include the Meisner Technique, Stanislavski's System and Lee Strasberg's Method. I even introduced a later method called the Practical Aesthetics Acting Technique which was created by David Mamet and William H. Macy in 1983 and expanded in 1984.

Hopefully, this gives a better overview of what the Drama Club entails. One of the end goals is to put on more performances for LUMC, as well as by giving the students practice by speaking at Sunday Services.
