#### YOUTH GROUP HEADED TO IGNITE THIS FALL



On Friday, September 28 thru Sunday, September 30, members of our Youth Group are planning on attending Ignite 2018: World Changers in Wildwood. Of course, those interested in attending should contact Bonnie Marshall at (609) 276-5750. But what exactly is Ignite?

Having attended the Ignite Conference with the youth group from the United Methodist Church of Oakhurst, I can honestly say that it is a very uplifting weekend where children that are currently in grades 6 thru 12 can feel the presence of God through prayer, music, workshops and guest speakers. Last year, many attendees (including my Oakhurst group) were able to send out 80,000 meals to Zambia in Southern Africa. Many of us stayed past the

allotted time frame to ensure that this goal was met. Nothing could compare to this feeling of accomplishment knowing that we assisted in feeding the hungry.

This year's theme is based on Matthew 5:14: "You are the light of the world." Celebrating the festival's 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the Ignite Squad is hoping to enlighten our youth to "recognize the Divine Spark" within them. After all, they are our future world changers! Currently, scheduled to appear are Bread Of Stone, Bryan "DJ Vow" Martinez, Byron "Mr. Talkbox" Chambers and Rachel Billups, with there still being time for more special guests to be added.

Bread Of Stone is a 4-piece band fronted by brothers Ben and Bill Kristijanto, with Tim Barnes and Jason Ferris comprising the rhythm section. They reached number one on Billboard's Christian Rock charts in 2015 with their single "Porcelain." They started The Light Project in Indonesia, which "empowers those who are not afraid to carry the light of Jesus into the darkness, even when faced with persecution."

Bryan "DJ Vow" Martinez spreads the word of God by spinning an eclectic mix of hip hop and electronic dance music. Byron "Mr. Talkbox" Chambers has worked with TobyMac, Group 1 Crew, Nathan East, Marvin Sapp and Erica Campbell. A two-time Dove Award winner and a Grammy nominee, Chambers has performed and toured with Jonathan Butler and The Mighty Clouds Of Joy. With roots based in Gospel music, Chambers spent a year working with NSYNC before returning to those roots. He is featured on TobyMac's latest single "Feel It," which spent seven weeks at number one on the Hot AC Christian Billboard charts.

Rachel Billups is a Campus Pastor at the Ginghamsburg Church in Tipp City, as well as an Executive Pastor for the Next Generation Ministry. She is an ordained Elder with the United Methodist Church. In addition, Billups has co-authored "Down To Earth: Hopes and Fears of all the Year Are Met in Thee Tonight" and "Sent: Delivering the Gift of Hope at Christmas."

During a scheduled time on Saturday afternoon, youth can sign up to show off their talent by performing at an open mic session. However, those wishing to perform should sign up early. In other words, put your name on the list on Friday evening. While meals are the responsibility of the attendee, you can purchase snacks, as well as some light fare at lunchtime, inside the Convention Center. As it was with my experience at Keswick, this experience can be just as rewarding for the adults as it is for the children.
