THE TRADITION OF HUNTING FOR EASTER EGGS



Have you ever thought to yourself as to why so many organizations host Easter Egg Hunts during the Easter season? While Christians know why they celebrate Easter, what does this have to do with searching for eggs or even bunnies for that matter? While doing some research, I found out that the Easter Egg Hunt actually dates back thousands of years. With roots in paganism, some believe that the name Easter was derived from the Teutonic goddess of springtime, Eostre. Rabbits came to be associated with the season due to their connection

with fertility. Germanic cultures felt that Eostre and her fertile bunnies symbolized the start of the spring season.

The association of egg-laying rabbits and spring remained intact, even as paganism was being mostly replaced by monotheism. When Christianity came into play, the egg began to be seen as a symbol of life and rebirth, thus becoming a representation of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Some historians believe that the eggs were traditionally dyed red to represent the blood of Jesus Christ.

Around the 18th century, the Pennsylvania Dutch told tales of an egg-laying rabbit known as Oschter Haws, who would deposit eggs in grassy fields. These people would cheer their children on as the little ones would create nests for Oschter Haws to lay its eggs in. The children would run out into the fields and then find any eggs that were left behind. Eventually, these nests developed into Easter baskets.

According to Lizette Larson Miller, a professor with the Graduate Theological Union of Berkeley, Martin Luther, a Protestant reformer, was known to organize egg hunts for his congregation in Germany during

the late 16th century. The men were the ones who hid the eggs, while the women and children were the scavengers. It wasn't until many years later that the real dyed eggs were replaced by the plastic ones that are popular today. In addition, this plastic variety was made to twist open for the insertion of treats. For the chocolate fans, it should be noted that the very first Cadbury eggs were produced in 1875.

The Lacey United Methodist Church will be holding their annual East Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 13th at 11AM. Children of all ages are invited to participate. PL is expected to sit down with the children before the chaos begins to give an uplifting message and prayer. Every child will receive a gift bag, as well as getting the opportunity to win one of three baskets. In addition, there will be cookies and juice available for all of the exhausted egg hunters.



The Easter Bunny is expected to make an appearance with possible goodies, but definitely for photo ops. This Easter Egg Hunt is sponsored by Jesus Christ, who died for our sins. As Jesus told Martha in John 11: 25 - 26, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"
