PRAYING FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY



Let's say a prayer for the family and friends of Elijah Clayton and Taylor Robertson. Both were recently killed at an e-sports gaming tournament when a gunman, who happened to be participating in the event, open fired

injuring 10 participants and killing 2. For those who were wartching the livestream on Twitch, the gunshots were alarmingly heard. Unfortunately, incidents like this are becoming more and more common. Schools, concerts, movie theatres and churches have been some of the targets.

The above incident happened in Jacksonville, Florida, on a Sunday. The FBI has been reported to have stated that 50% of all active shooter incidents have occurred on Sundays according to various active shooter websites.

Our ushers recently went through an active shooter training at LUMC. This seminar was based on the ALICE Training Program. ALICE stands for alert, lockdown, inform, counter and evacuate. Alert is basically recognizing that some sort of danger is present. Lockdown relates to barricading yourself and others in a room only if evacuation is not a safe option. Inform is referring to using the tools available to provide real time information to others about the situation currently existing. Counter does not mean confronting the gunman, but rather creating some kind of distraction that could hinder the accuracy of the gunman's aim. Don't be afraid to throw a hymnal! Evacuate is exactly what it sounds like. Feel free to ask the ushers what they learned at the training. Most of all, don't be a hero and stay safe. We need to pray for those lost souls that feel the need to bring harm to others.

Scheduled for part of October is "Whodunnit?," which is a series of one-act murder mysteries. "Listen," written by Sami DeSocio, is scheduled to open on November 30.

The above items are only a small sample of the amount of donations received from local businesses, and even more are still coming in. At 3pm, people will be able to preview all of the items up for auction. The auction will begin promptly at 4pm, with church funnyman Dean Abramo acting as the auctioneer.

The proceeds from the auction will benefit the LUMC, various outreach programs and Vetwork. Getting its start as the Ocean County POW / MIA Organization, Vetwork is located at 103 North Main Street in Forked River. A non-profit organization, Vetwork is "dedicated to assisting our honorably discharged veterans in coming home and getting situated." In addition, they assist Ocean County veterans with professional counseling in regards to alcohol and drug abuse. Vetwork also plays a role in helping them handle any PTSD issues. Homelessness is another area where Vetwork lends a hand, along with other financial and employment difficulties. They also assist in pointing those veterans to the proper avenue as to where they can claim their VA benefits that they had no idea existed!

The small price of \$5 includes admission to the event and an auction paddle, as well as a sandwich and a drink. The sandwich and drink only added \$2 to the price for entry and a paddle. For \$1, you can enter but you wouldn't be part of the bidding process. There will be food and beverages available to purchase during the event. This event is designed to help the church help others and isn't that what we as Christians are designed to do.

JAM PROGRAM PREPARING TO START

On Sunday, September 9, the JAM (Jesus and Me) Sunday School program will begin. Teachers, substitutes and helpers are currently being introduced to the fall schedule. As usual, the classes run during church service from 9:15am until 10:15am. Classes are broken up into 4 groups: $K - 2^{nd}$ grade, 3rd grade – 4th grade, 5th grade – 7th grade and 8th grade – high school. Besides the scheduled lesson, the children will be learning the Lord's Prayer, the Serenity Prayer, Psalm 23, the Apostle's Creed and the 10 Commandments. This fall will see a heavy concentration on Genesis and Exodus, with some New Testament scriptures mixed in.
