## SHOE DRIVE IN FULL SWING

The LUMC Fundraising Team has partnered with the funds2orgs group to help raise funds for our church. As you probably already know, we have been collecting gently used or new pairs of shoes since last month. All shoes donated must be in good condition, clean and still wearable. All shoes should be dry, with their soles attached and no holes anywhere on the shoe. If you wouldn't give them to a friend, then they are not worthy to be donated. Your donation goes beyond raising money for LUMC, because they are given a second life for those in need.

600 million shoes go into landfills across the United States annually. Most of these shoes can still be worn. These shoes collected will help

others in developing nations start micro-enterprises that will create sustainable incomes for their families. The nations that are being targeted include Haiti, Colombia and Tanzania.

Because funds2orgs is designed to help people from these nations escape poverty, the shoes aren't given away. If they gave away the shoes, the local market for shoes and clothing would be decimated, as well as the local job market. It should also be noted that some developing countries, such as Africa, do not permit apparel to be given away.

According to the World Bank, Haiti is the most impoverished country in the Western Hemisphere. 59% of Haiti's population live below the national poverty level of \$2.41 USD per day. 24% of the population live below the national extreme poverty line of \$1.23 USD per day. The average per capita income is \$480 USD annually!

The shoes that end up not being sold in these countries are used to make and fix products or create something new. This can include insulation for homes, stuffing for car seats or furniture. Excess scraps will be sent to Pakistan for re-purposing. We will be collecting shoes into July. For more information, contact Lori Osborn at (732) 904-6461 or the LUMC Office at (609) 693-5222.
